In past articles, we've shone the spotlight on this year's City-Bay star, Lee Morgan - a legend whose been involved with City-Bay's history for 50 years. We've shared what first got him to the start line back in 1974, what keeps him coming back, and his go-to strategies for training, goal-setting, and nutrition.

But there's another important chapter in Lee's City-Bay journey: the power of fundraising and the impact it can have on the community.

For Lee, that impact began in 2009 when he helped champion the then-fledgling HeartKids organisation. Lee was involved as Chairperson of HeartKids SA and as National Board-member to implement better coordination with HeartKids Australia.

Each year, between 2400 and 3000 babies in Australia are born with a form of congenital heart disease - making it the most common congenital disorder in newborns affecting 1 in 100 births.

In 2009, the HeartKids organisation combined with its volunteers, rallied 575 participants to walk and run the City-Bay. Thanks to support from businesses, fundraisers, and generous individuals, they raised over \$37,000! These funds were critical in developing the organisation and providing support assistance at the Adelaide Children's Hospital. With the proceeds of the 2009 event, the HeartKids organisation grew nationwide.

Meet Enzo Cornejo, a bright, resilient young boy living with Progeria, a rare genetic condition that causes rapid aging in children. Diagnosed just before his third birthday, Enzo is one of only a handful of children in Australia with this condition, and the only one currently known to be living with it in the country.

Each year, Team Enzo comes together for the City-Bay Fun Run in Adelaide, and 2025 marks a truly special milestone. Earlier this year, Enzo underwent a successful Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation (TAVI) - a life-extending procedure that has given him more precious years to walk, roll, and smile his way through this beloved event.

On September 21, Enzo will once again take on the 6km course, often in his wheelchair, surrounded by a sea of green shirts and smiling faces. His team - made up of family, friends, teachers, and supporters, will walk, run, and cheer their way through the 3km, 6km, and 12km routes, united by one mission: to raise awareness and funds for Enzo's ongoing medical care and participation in life-changing clinical trials in Boston.
